Purpose of the First Conference

What does Alabama agriculture look like now? What will it look like in the year 2020? What effect does it have on the environment? How can the rural-urban interface exist in harmony in the years ahead, particularly with those issues related to the environment?

This conference will help make all of us more aware of the state's agricultural industry, and gain new insights for dealing with current issues and changes on the horizon.
